

Phrasal Verbs with “Get”



Get up

to rise from bed or a sitting position



Get in

to enter (a place or vehicle)



Get over

to recover from (an illness, heartbreak, etc.)



Get by

to survive or manage, especially with difficulty



Get out

to leave (a place or vehicle)



Get along (with)

to have a good relationship



Get back

to return to a place



Get ahead

to make progress (often in work/life)



Get around

to travel or move from place to place



Get it

to understand something



Get rid of

to throw away or remove something unwanted



Get together

to meet socially



Get down

to depress or discourage someone



Get out of

to avoid doing something



Get into

to become involved in something (a hobby, habit, or trouble)



Get back at

to take revenge
